And last but not least, Earl loved his Detroit Red Wings. He had many great memories from the early days at the Olympia with Gordie Howe and always enjoyed following them. His grandson Brian took him to Washington, D.C. on Honor Flight and was given a hero's welcome. A day he will never forget. He was well known as an honest man and someone who enjoyed his family and not drift away from his routine.
